

Response times for the most urgent calls

Police in Salt Lake County took anywhere from 3 minutes, 34 seconds to 14 minutes to arrive on the scene of their most urgent calls, according to a Salt Lake Tribune computer analysis of nearly half a million police call records. Charts show the mix of select critical emergency calls each city received between 2004 and 2007, along with the average response time for each type of call. Charts are sized and ranked, left to right, by the total number of critical calls the cities handled for 2006.

Proportion of domestic armed incidents



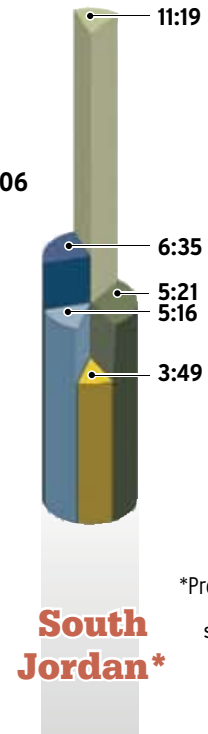
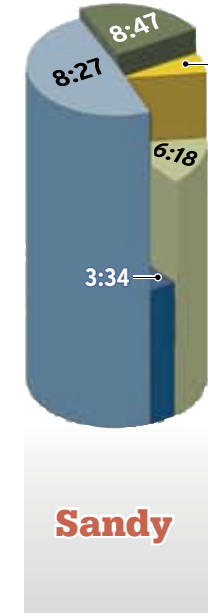
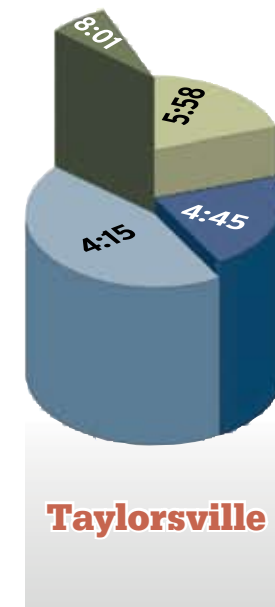
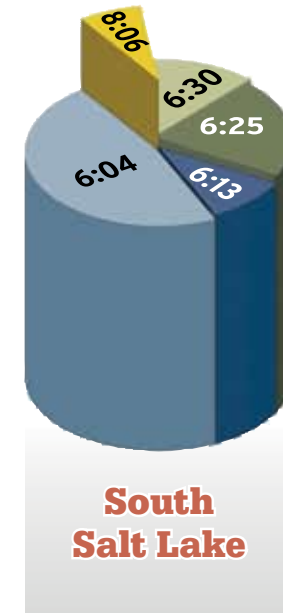
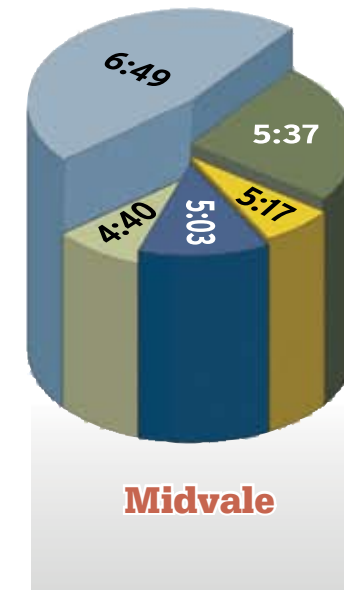
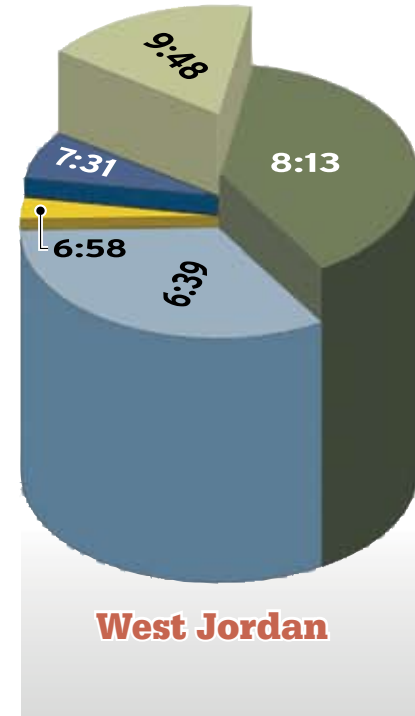
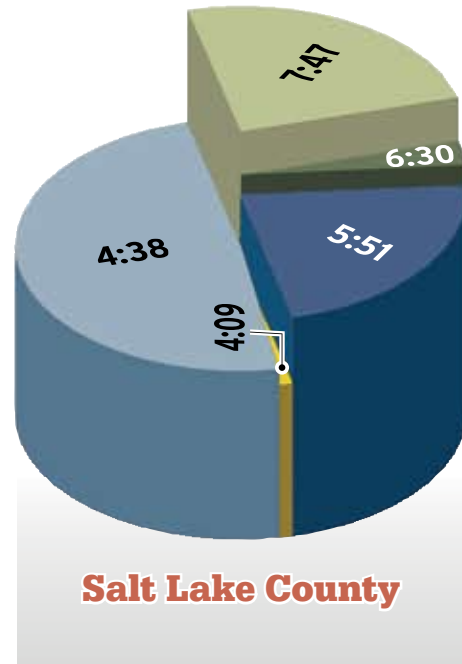
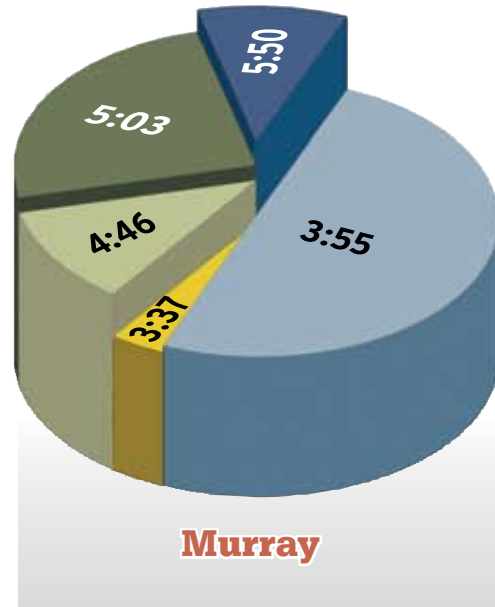
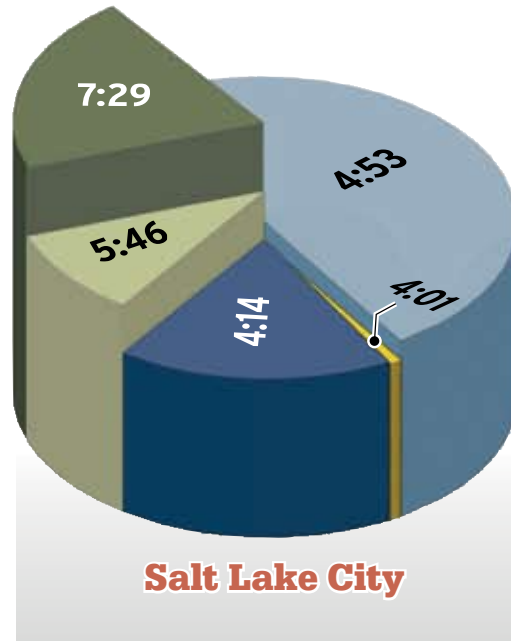
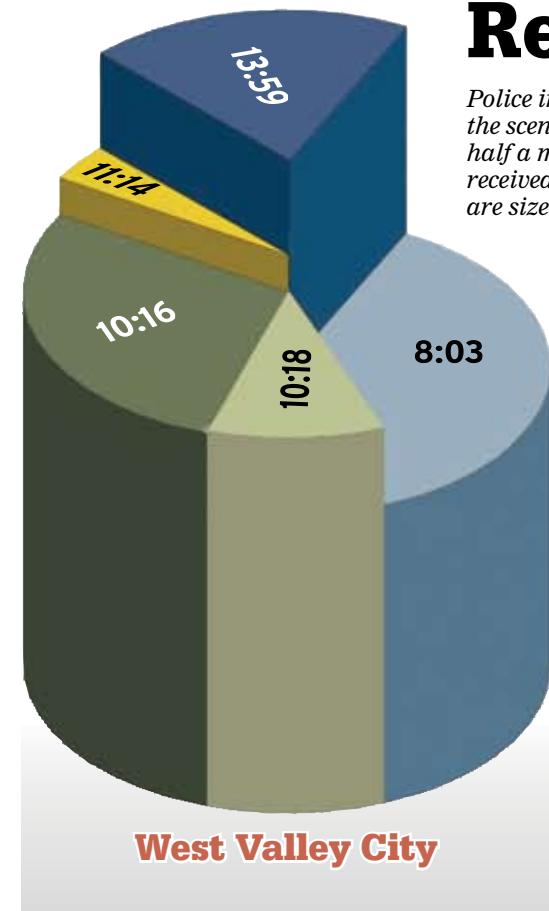
Proportion of rape/sex offense incidents
